The Resetar Residential Hotel was built in the 1920s and was later converted to 12 one-bedroom and 78 studio apartments. It is currently home for more than 100 people, about half of whom were homeless before moving into the Resetar.

This former hotel is located at the center of Watsonville's downtown and was a hub of community activity in the 1920s, '30s and '40s. Its spacious lobby is still a center of daily residential activity.

After Abode Services formed a strategic alliance with Housing for Independent People in 2012, a full-time onsite service coordinator from Abode Services began offering services to residents.

Many of the residents have lived at this property for many years, some for over a decade. The Resetar is still one of the only affordable places to live in Santa Cruz County for low-income households.

Abode Services is in the process of transforming the Resetar into a model of supportive housing for people with special needs .
